Forklift License Goodyear - Obtaining a forklift certification or forklift license in North America will require the one training to carry out classroom instruction in addition to hands-on training. The provincial, federal and state regulatory bodies are responsible for the training, licensing and certification for powered industrial truck operators. Operators may get a license either through training administered by the employer or by a third party. Regardless, regulatory requirements should be met. Recertification is required every two to three years.

The forklift is a powered industrial machinery that is designed along with numerous alternatives, like for instance stand-up and sit down models, propane and electric versions, and different types and sizes to meet the industrial needs of employees. Operator training courses are often individualized to be able address the particular types and uses for which the operator is training. Training on a sit-down, gas-powered forklift in a warehouse setting will not be the same as training on a propane-powered, stand-up lift truck within a shipyard. The various forklifts and their applications makes it impossible to establish universal licensing requirements for all equipment and businesses. Regulatory standards, therefore, have a tendency not to concentrate on particular course requirements but rather on the outcome of individual training programs.

On the job training which is supplied by the employer is the most common form of forklift training certification and licensing. The employer who provides this method of certification is needed to offer practical training and classroom sessions on machinery at their place of work. Employers may opt to train personnel on each and every type of forklift separately, or to train them on all equipment combined. The program incorporates forklift operation procedures, safety procedures, company rules and forklift maintenance. Subject matters specific to the worksite, like for example dangerous conditions or materials, should be covered. Following classroom learning, operators are taught how to safely operate and use every kind of lift truck on the worksite.

Certification through a third-party vendor usually needs an on-site component together with hands-on practice.

Typically, a certification provided by an employer would not transfer from the existing employer to the next employer. Acquiring a lift truck license through employer-provided training enables the operator to run a forklift for that specific employer only.

Forklift safety would always be an important factor of the forklift license training, even if the particulars of the safety training would be dependent upon the machines being used. Some safety issues will vary for each employer and industry. Both employer-provided training and third-party providers may have to address extra requirements for safety training in applicable industries, like for instance in offshore and marine operations.
